

- We engage policymakers, industry leaders, and others with public opinion research to advance support for nonpartisan solutions.

WE USE SCIENCE to assess and advance practical solutions that meet the needs of all Idahoans. From clean energy to tree planting, Idaho has effective, science-based strategies to limit emissions and store carbon all while protecting nature and revitalizing our economy.

The Idaho Climate-Economy Impacts Assessment is a nonpartisan, science-based resource to help Idaho business leaders and policymakers plan for a productive, prosperous, and resilient Idaho economy. This assessment connects the latest scientific research on Idaho's changing climate with economic risks and opportunities that impact businesses, residents, and local and state economies. The Nature Conservancy is a major supporter of this effort led by the McClure Public Policy Research Center at the University of Idaho. The two-year study concludes in 2021. NATURAL CLIMATE SOLUTIONS

Healthy, functioning natural and working lands are among Idaho's greatest assets for addressing climate change. The Nature Conservancy in Idaho has invested in protecting and restoring these places for more than 50 years. Natural and working lands in Idaho store a tremendous amount of carbon and have great potential to store even more. We're working with farmers and other landowners to store more carbon in the soil, which is good for crops and reduces emissions.
