

# Steps to review and update NBSAPs (National Biodiversity Strategies and Action Plans)

## **APRIL 2023**





> Identify stakeholders and communicate the process: include stakeholders who will be engaged and/or affected by biodiversity management/policies including Indigenous Peoples and Local Communities, the private sector, NGOs. Engage in two-way communication about the NBSAP update and implementation plan, and the voluntary contributions of stakeholders. Build political will.


> Review and update biodiversity and ecosystem services assessments (including use of resources by sectors such as agriculture, infrastructure, fisheries, forestry) and known trends. Assessing knowledge gaps is important, as is the need for new knowledge.

> Review and update legal, and policymaking and regulatory capabilities as well as financial levers. The latter includes expenditure review, new finance mechanisms, positive and harmful incentives, and also finance actors.
