- Motor vehicles are restricted to designated roads. All terrain vehicles and bicycles are not permitted.


Snowmobiles must follow designated trails. Maps are available from local snowmobile clubs.

Generators and motorized tools disturb the wilderness experience for others and are not permitted.

To avoid disturbance of native wildlife and introduction of invasive plant species, horses, pets and other domestic animals are not permitted—exception: dogs are welcome on the Ice Cave Trail only and must be leashed at all times. Please carry out pet waste.

Except as hunting and fishing laws allow, do not collect or remove plants or animals from the preserve.

Pack it in, pack it out! Remove all belongings and trash.





